Theological Beliefs

The below is our statement of faith and belief.

THE GOSPEL: We believe the 'gospel' is the good news that through Jesus the power of God's kingdom has entered history to renew all creation, beginning with people (Rom. 8:19-23). When we believe and rely on Jesus' work and record (rather than our own) for our relationship to God, that kingdom power comes upon us and begins to work through us. The good news is, we're accepted by God not by what we've done, but by what He's done. (1 Cor. 15:1-4)

THE GODHEAD (THE TRIUNE GOD): We believe there is one God who eternally exists in three persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, who is co-eternal in being, co-eternal in nature, co-equal in power and glory, having the same attributes and perfections (Deut. 6:4; 2 Cor. 13:14)

THE SCRIPTURES: We believe the Bible to be the God-breathed, inerrant, infallible, and authoritative word of God, and the final authority for faith and life. (2 Tim. 3:16, 17; 2 Pet. 1:20, 21; Matt. 5:18; John 16:12, 13).

THE PERSON AND WORK OF CHRIST: We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, became man without ceasing to be God, having been conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary in order that He might reveal God and redeem sinful man (John 1:1-2, 14; Luke 1:35). We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ accomplished ¬our redemption through His death on the cross as a representative, vicarious, substitutionary sacrifice, and that our justification is made sure by His literal, physical resurrection from the dead (Rom. 3:24; 1 Pet. 2:24; Eph. 1:7; 1 Pet. 1:3-5). We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where, as our High Priest, He fulfills the ministry as Representative, Intercessor, and Advocate (Acts 1:9, 10; Heb. 7:25; Heb. 9:24; Rom. 8:34; 1 John 2:1-2). We believe Jesus is coming again to judge the living and the dead (1 Pet. 4:5; Rom. 14:9; 2 Tim. 4:1). We believe that Jesus Christ, the second person of the Holy Trinity, was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, died a sacrificial death for the sins of the world, rose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven, and is coming again to judge the living and the dead and to establish God's kingdom of righteousness and peace on the earth.

THE PERSON AND WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT: We believe that the Holy Spirit is a person who convicts the world of sin, righteousness and of judgment; He is the Supernatural Agent in regeneration, baptizing all believers into the body of Christ, indwelling and sealing them unto the day of redemption (John 16:8-11; 2 Cor. 3:6; 1 Cor. 12:12-14; Rom. 8:9; Eph. 5:18).

THE TOTAL DEPRAVITY OF MAN: We believe that man was created in the image and likeness of God, but that through Adam's sin the race fell, inherited a sinful nature, and became alienated from God; man is totally depraved and of himself utterly unable to remedy his lost condition and incapable of meriting God's favor. (Gen. 1:26, 27; Rom. 3:22, 23; 5:12; Eph. 2:1-3, 12).

THE SALVATION AND ASSURANCE OF BELIEVER: We believe that salvation is the gift of God brought to man by grace and received by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, whose precious blood was shed on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins (Eph. 2:8-10; John 1:12; Eph. 1:7; 1 Pet. 1:18-19). Thus, all the redeemed, once saved, are kept by God's power and are secure in Christ forever (John 6:37-40; 10:27-30; Rom. 8:1, 38, 39; 1 Cor. 1:4-8; 1 Pet. 1:5).

THE MINISTRY AND GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT: We believe that God is sovereign in the bestowing of spiritual gifts. It is, however, the believer's responsibility to attempt to develop their sovereignly given spiritual gift(s). We believe in the baptism of the Holy Spirit according to Acts 2:4; 10:46; 19:6. We also hold that the real evidence of the filling of the Holy Spirit is love and responsive obedience to the Word of God (John 14:15;14:23;15:10), a Christ-like life, a showing forth of Christ's character, nature as evident thru the fruit of the Holy Spirit (I Cor. 13:1-7,13; Gal. 5:22-23, Eph. 4:7-8) and boldness to be Christ's witness. We believe that it is the privilege and responsibility of every believer to minister according to the gift(s) and grace of God that is given to him (Rom. 12:1-8; 1 Cor. 13; 1 Peter 4:10-11).

THE CHURCH: We believe that the church, which is the body and espoused bride of Christ, is a spiritual organism made up of all born-again persons (Eph. 1:22, 23; 5:25-27; 1 Cor. 12:12-14; 2 Cor. 11:2). We believe that the establishment and continuance of local churches is clearly taught and defined in the New Testament Scriptures (Acts 14:27; 18:22; 20:17; 1 Tim. 3:1-3; Titus 1:5-11). We believe in the autonomy of the local churches, free of any external control (Acts 13:1-4; 15:19-31; 20:28; Rom. 16:1,4; 1 Cor. 3:9, 16; 1 Cor. 5:4-7, 13; 1 Pet. 5:1-4). We recognize believer's baptism and the Lord's supper as scriptural means of testimony for the church (Matt. 28:19, 20; Acts 2:41, 42; Acts 18:8; 1 Cor. 11:23-26). Finally, we believe that Jesus as the chief Shepherd of the church appoints qualified men (undershepherds/pastors/elders) to faithfully lead, feed, and protect His flock. (Acts 20:28-35, 1 Pet. 5:4)
